Session Descriptions:

Michigan eLibrary Services- Ann Kaskinen

Our conference starts off with a group presentation from Michigan eLibrary services. This is a resource that can be accessed by all educators and contains a wealth of information. In April 2022, 44% of medical practices noted that medical assistants (MA's) were the most difficult position for them to recruit in a poll completed by the Medical Group Management Association (MGMA). Industry leaders are citing several factors for these difficulties, including stressors from the pandemic and candidates lacking don't have the requisite training. In this workshop, attendees will build replicas of human anatomy using clay and a specially designed skeletal model in a classroom setting. Educators will learn how to implement a unique curriculum system which helps students create a kinesthetic map of human anatomy. They will acquire the knowledge to engage science students with immediate, hands-on learning using a proven method that is nationally recognized to increase student retention and test scores. This workshop will emphasize directional terms, planes, cavities, and landmarks on the skeletal model. Focus will be placed on building the rotator cuff.

Curriculum planning and development sessions- Discipline Specific

Throughout the conference there will be curriculum planning and development sessions for current and future instructors to create lesson plans that meet the needs of the specific discipline. Feedback from prior conferences indicated that time was needed to dedicate to the creation of common lessons that can be used in the discipline specific area. Dental Science and PT/Sports Medicine will be held on Thursday, with the CNA/Patient Care tech and Phlebotomy being on Friday.
